Alred Beulig has been working on his SeaRay project and has the left wing done with work on the right starting. Dave Conrad, Technical Advisor for the Chapter, offered advice on documenting the project and will be checking in on progress soon.

Dave Harm is working on the the canopy for his RV-12 build and the final stages of building his hangar at the Wausau airport. He is awaiting the door and expects it in soon.

The Learn Build Fly Legacy has both wings painted and covered in a very nice looking white, orange, and blue paint scheme. Work is continuing on mounting the doors to the fuselage as well as finishing tab welding. Other weekly projects have included a youth ground school, rocketry, and sign fabrication. Future projects will include model airplane flying and some more part design and fabrication.

SEPTEMBER MEETING NOTES

- The September meeting was held on Saturday, September 12 at the Learn Build Fly hangar. The meeting was called to order at 12:18 p.m.
- A motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Jerry Feldbruegge and seconded by Bob Mohr. All voted in favor. Currently, 640 has \$30,924.34 in savings, \$710.46 in checking and \$20 cash on hand.
- Wausau Flying Service held their first Pilot for a Day since the COVID-19 outbreak and had great attendance. 40 people signed up and participated on June 13.

- A motion to adjourn was made at 1:02 p.m. by George Michalski and seconded by Jerry Feldbruegge.

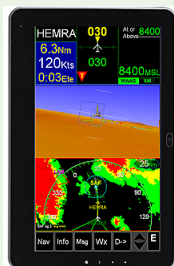
